

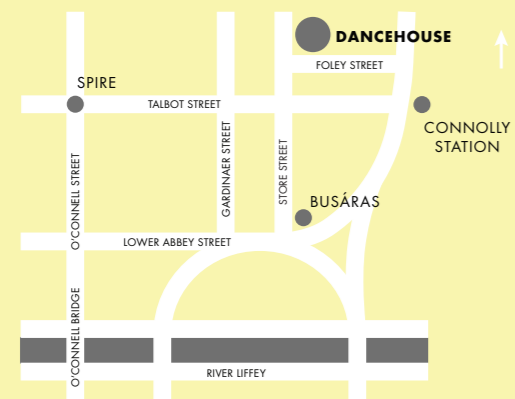

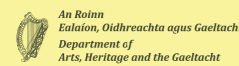

DAILY MORNING CLASS

Development Programme

CREATION STUDIO

Commencing in January 2015 we announce details of our Creation Studio, an exciting new addition to the Dance Ireland programme. We have dedicated Studio 4 as our creation studio – a whole-time space available for rehearsal rentals. This new development allows the space to be used whole time on an exclusive basis during DanceHouse opening hours, giving more flexibility for companies to use set pieces/props during rehearsals, with the advantage of not having to strike at the end of the day. Additional facilities include a sound system, lighting rig and seating area which facilitates work-in-progress presentations.

DANCE IRELAND RESIDENCY

The backbone of our programme remains the Dance Ireland Residency programme. A key means by which we support the creation of new work, and ensure that Dance Ireland members maintain a studio practice.

Applications are accepted on an ongoing basis; so if you are a professional member (individual/company) of Dance Ireland, you are eligible to apply for a residency. Ranging from 1 to 4 weeks, Dance Ireland Residencies can be used for research, development and rehearsal of new and existing work. Find out how to apply online now at danceireland.ie.

MENTORED RESIDENCY SUPPORT AWARDS

Dance Ireland's Mentored Residency Support Awards will support one proposal each from within classical ballet, traditional Irish dance, contemporary dance and in a new development, integrated dance. Applications for 2015/16 will open in April with the open call announced at danceireland.ie.

TYRONE GUTHRIE CENTRE AND DANCE IRELAND RESIDENTIAL RESIDENCY AT ANNAGHMAKERRIG

For the second year we partner with the Tyrone Guthrie Centre in offering a 2-week residential residency in Annaghmakerrig in spring 2015. Open to professional members of Dance Ireland, this is an opportunity to spend time away from your normal working day to focus on the development of a new performance work, either alone or in collaboration. In addition to full board and lodging for up to 3 people (maximum), the award covers access to the dance studio at Annaghmakerrig and a small fund to cover expenses. ASSOCIATE ARTIST

Now entering its fourth year, our Associate Artist programme takes a twist in 2015! Dance Ireland will offer one Associate Artist place for a 12-month period, however this year the position will focus on a creative artist from within classical ballet or traditional Irish dance.

In advance of issuing an Open Call in April, we will embark on a number of national information sessions in February and March; further details available from danceireland.ie.

NEW MOVEMENTS

New Movements is an informal, no tech, studio presentation of work 'fresh from the studio' followed by audience Q&A. These presentations usually follow the completion of a Dance Ireland Residency or supported work. Visit danceireland.ie to see our full performance listings.

FRIDAY NEW WORKS SERIES

Friday New Works Series showcases the latest dance/performance work by Dance Ireland members. Dance makers present their work as part of curated mixed-bill programmes in DanceHouse. Next up will be July 2015. Open Call coming soon at danceireland.ie.

MIND YOUR STEP

Coming this March, *Mind your step*, is a weekend of events, which aims to explore the connection between choreography, live performance, walkscapes and urban planning. Striving to create new audiences for dance and raise awareness about the development and regeneration of urban areas, *Mind your step* will comprise a conference/think tank and performances. This Dance Ireland event is conceived and curated by Giulia Galvan and will be delivered in collaboration with Eleanor Creighton and Argyris Argyrou as part of Dance Ireland's commitment to Léim, a dance leadership project funded by Creative Europe and the Arts Council.

RE-PRESENTING IRELAND

Re-Presenting Ireland is a showcase initiative by Culture Ireland, Dance Ireland and Dublin Dance Festival.

One of the most popular events in our dance calendar, *Re-Presenting Ireland* showcases a small sample of current Irish work for national and international peers. Taking place on 22, 23, 29 & 30 May in DanceHouse, Dance Ireland members are invited to make an application (deadline Friday 09 January 2015).

COMMUNICATING DANCE
